The European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS) has decided to fill a vacancy in his establishment plan for the grades AD7-AD9.

JOB DESCRIPTION :

The EDPS is an independent supervisory authority with the task of ensuring that the institutions and bodies of the European Union respect the rights to privacy and protection of personal data when they process personal data or develop new policies.

A specific task of the EDPS is to ensure the supervision of large-scale European information systems, in close cooperation with the national data protection authorities. Most of the existing systems relate to the external border policies of the EU, such as the Schengen Information System, the Visa Information System and Eurodac (for asylum policy), but we also deal with the Internal Market Information System.

Data protection is an essential element of these systems, which may have a huge impact on EU citizens and third country nationals. These systems usually consist of a central infrastructure, which is supervised by the EDPS, and national parts, under supervision of national authorities. The EDPS facilitates the coordination of the various supervisory activities. Acting under the authority of the Supervisor, Assistant Supervisor and Director, the officer will take part in a number of tasks in accordance with the instructions of the Head of the Supervision and Enforcement Unit, and in close cooperation with colleagues in different teams within the EDPS, and within data protection national authorities.

We would like to recruit a new colleague who can bring creativity, experience and enthusiasm to the EDPS, to strengthen our contribution to the organisation and further development of coordinated supervision, and in particular:

- Ensure the supervision of the central infrastructure of the systems, in close cooperation with the colleagues of the Information and Technology Policy sector of the EDPS. This task will notably include performing inspections and audits, and may include other tasks such as informing and advising controllers and data subjects on their rights and obligations, and hearing and investigating complaints and other requests of data subjects and conduct inquiries;
- Cooperate with the colleagues of the Policy and Consultation Unit of the EDPS, in ensuring the secretariat facilitating coordinated supervision of these systems.
- Inform and advise EU institutions and bodies on the application of data protection provisions in these specific areas.
- Contribute to the development of the policies, with a small team of colleagues, and in close cooperation with the national data protection authorities.
- Contribute to a smooth cooperation between all involved in these areas, and develop an efficient network.

These activities may require missions away from head office.

This is an area which is in full development and strategic for data protection. We therefore look for someone who is proactive, and who finds reconciliation of security and privacy a stimulating task. We specifically look for someone who has the capacities to give guidance to our activities in this specific area.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE:

- to have successfully accomplished and completed university studies in the field of law attested by a diploma;
- to have a good knowledge of the structure and functioning of the European Union and of its institutions, the treaties and other fields of EU law in relation to the position;
- to have relevant professional experience as well as an extensive capacity for analysis and written expression;
- to have the ability and to be ready to work in a small team in the dynamic environment of a relatively small institution, and in close cooperation with colleagues from national authorities;
- a good knowledge of the legislation on data protection and its implications for EU institutions and bodies will be considered as an advantage;
- a general knowledge of modern information technology is recommended;
- a thorough knowledge of one of the official languages of the European Union and a good knowledge of another EU language is required. For practical reasons, a good knowledge, preferably active, of English and French is desirable. Knowledge of other official languages would be considered as an advantage.

SOME FACTS ABOUT THE EDPS AND OUR STAFF

EDPS: The smallest and youngest of the EU institutions

The EDPS was established in Brussels in 2004. It has about 60 staff members (most of them EU officials but also some contract agents) working full or part time.

EDPS: A great place to work

We believe that a good working environment is a precondition to ensure staff engagement and well-being and that it is essential to strike a good balance between work and private life. To this end we provide staff with a modern working environment using familiar IT tools, a good balance between work and private life (using flexitime and telework), and very little hierarchy or bureaucracy.

EDPS: A place to grow and develop your career

Due to the small size of the institution, our staff enjoys a high level of autonomy and diversity of tasks, working in small, dynamic teams. We have developed an ambitious "Learning & development policy" to foster personal development and to improve personal skills and competencies.

Our staff benefit from the same mobility policy as the larger EU institutions such as the Commission, Parliament and the Council, because the EDPS is treated as an EU institution for the purposes of the Staff Regulations and the Financial Regulation. As a result, staff can transfer their grade, step, seniority and all the other career elements seamlessly between the EDPS and any of these institutions. Indeed, a spell with the EDPS can be a useful career step for officials who would like to work with us for a while and then return to continue their careers long-term within the larger institutions. For example, four of the seven EDPS desk officers who were transferred to the Commission in 2012 and 2013 moved to junior management posts.
