Specifically for this operation, data subjects have direct access to leave data in STREAMLINE.

Automated. Applications for leave are made in STREAMLINE. There are paper forms for applications for family and parental leave and unpaid leave on personal grounds. Special documentation may be required for special leave as described in the leave guide pp. 10-12.

Staff have access to their own leave records in STREAMLINE. Other staff of the same unit can see the fact of an absence but <u>not</u> the reason for it, in accordance with DPO advice. Family and parental leave applications (and unpaid leave on personal grounds) are handled by the Staff Management and Careers Unit of DG PERS.

13/ retention policy of (categories of) personal data

Papers files are retained for 5 years, except for documents which relate to financial transactions (payment in respect of leave not taken on termination of service) which are retained for 7 years. Records in STREAMLINE go back to 2008 when leave processing in STREAMLINE commenced. The application "CONGÉ" contains earlier records.
