1/ Name and adress of the controller

The EFSA Advisory Forum and Scientific Cooperation Unit (AFSCO Unit) (mandate provided in Annex I).

2/ Organisational parts of the institution or body entrusted with the processing of personal data

The possible levels of user access / management (functional groups) of the in-house expertise database are: (1) Administrator of the database – the AFSCO Unit, with full rights to access / manage the information stored in the database; (2) EFSA end-users, with access to the search environment of the in-house expertise database on a secure web portal.

EFSA In-house Scientific Expertise Database

4/ Purpose or purposes of the processing

To allow the identification of in-house scientific expertise in clearly identified situations, whenever EFSA has a specific need or when unexpected and/or urgent work of EFSA is required in the area of scientific risk assessments and/or data collection in food and feed safety.

5/ Description of the category or categories of data subjects

Scientific staff employed by EFSA (in the area of food and feed safety, nutrition, animal health and welfare, plant protection and

A) Information collected on the on-line application form: (1) general expert information (partially 'prefilled'); (2) institutional information (EFSA default information, 'prefilled' and not editable); (3) fields of competence; and (4) additional expert information (for further details on information requested for each of these categories of data, see **Annex II** – screenshots of the online application form). Information considered mandatory is marked on the online application form with an asterisk (*); the electronic system prevents applications missing such information to be submitted.

B) Information requested / provided via the online search tool: (1) skills (of experts); (2) refine search (parameters); (3) online profile displayed on search tool (for further details on information available for each of these categories of data, see **Annex III** - screenshots of the tabs of the online search tool; and **Annex IV** - example of online profile displayed on search tool).

Additional comments of the DPO: 1) The information in above (A) and (B) was provided by the data controller on the occasion of the art. 25 DPO notification. While preparing the notification, I made the data controller aware of the fact that the 'general expert information' and 'institutional information' collected in the application form (see Annex II) and some parts in the online profile displayed in the search tool (such as 'address for correspondence', 'professional situation', 'organization information' - see Annex IV) could be considered in conflict with the data quality requirement laid down in article 4(1c) of Regulation 45/2001. 2) The data controller opted for waiting the EDPS Opinion deciding on whether the data quality requirement is met or not, before arranging adjustments to the IT tool, for which the proportionality in view of available resources is anyway to be made. In this context it is important to add that the EFSA in-house scientific expertise database and the related online application module are supported by the IT tool supporting the EFSA Database of External Scientific Experts (EDB) previously prior checked by EDPS as case n° 2008-455. 3) Even though the EFSA in-house scientific

expertise database and the Experts Database (EDB) are supported by the same IT tool, the type of personal data processed (in-house scientific staff profiles vs. external experts), the purpose of the data processing and the way this is done (i.e. regarding transfers) are clearly distinct in both. For this reason, the EFSA in-house scientific expertise database and the Experts Database (EDB) are considered to be distinct personal data processing operations.

7/ Information to be given to data subjects

A) Information provided to data subjects before applying into the scientific expertise database:

In compliance with Article 11 of Regulation 45/2001, the information is provided by means of a data protection notice to be sent with an invitation email to applicant experts and is also existent on the on-line application form (see **Annex V** – application form data protection notice). The notice provides the following information:

- The purpose of the data processing operation;
- The identity of the controller;
- · Information on the data subjects;
- The categories of personal data processed, namely the need for submission of a valid application and for compliance with eligibility criteria;
- The recipients of personal data, i.e. the users of the in-house database search tool;
- The access right and right of rectification of experts included into the database as concerns their own profile;
- Information on the conservation of personal data and the process of renewal;
- The right to have recourse at any time to the European Data Protection Supervisor.
- B) Information provided by data subjects before (re)submission of application forms:
- Data subjects need to confirm that their personal and professional information submitted into the database is true and complete (A)

8/ Procedures to grant rights of data subjects(rights of access, to rectify, to block, to erase, to object)

Data subjects can exercise their rights at any time. As mentioned in the data protection notice (Annex V), data subjects can access, modify and/or delete their data/profiles in the database at any point in time entering the system with their user name and password.

The data processing operation is both automated (e.g. submission of application forms, searching for scientific experts) and manual (validity and eligibility checks with the purpose of inclusion / exclusion of in-house experts into / from the database).

10/ Storage media of data

The data collected is stored electronically in EFSA's scientific expertise database.

11/ Legal basis and lawfulness of the processing operation

Processing operation is clearly covered by the mandate of EFSA

The processing operation is covered by an internal EFSA mandate - Annex I

- The administrator of the database (the AFSCO Unit), with full access to information provided by data subjects for management purposes:

- EFSA staff granted access as users to the search environment of the in-house scientific expertise database, on a need basis;

The process for data renewal and expiry is based on 2 main procedures: (1) experts will be requested to regularly confirm their interest to remain listed in the database, and, if yes, to update their profiles; and (2) in-house scientific experts included in the database will be informed that they are able, at any time, to update/modify inaccurate or incomplete personal data on their individual profiles, or to request the exclusion of their profiles from the database (see internal mandate - **Annex I**).
