**DATA PROTECTION NOTICE**

The European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS) processes your personal data to organise and manage the conference *“Europe Votes 2019: How to Unmask and Fight Online Manipulation”*, which will take place at the Residence Palace, Salle Polak, 155, Rue de la Loi, 1040, Brussels, on 11th February 2019.

The event management includes processing: invitations and participation requests; event reporting including taking photos and audio-video recordings, and their possible distribution and publication; web streaming and event follow-up actions such as reports and/or press releases.

We process your personal data based on Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC (hereinafter “the Regulation”).

The following information is provided as established in Articles 14, 15 and 16 of the Regulation.

**Who is the controller?**

The controller is the European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS).

**What personal data do we process, who can access it and how long do we keep your personal data?**

We process:

- your contact details to register in the event via the [registration form](#) on our website: first and last name, organisation, email address;
- your consent to appear in photos and videos of the event.

The conference will be web-streamed. The EDPS may take photos and videos of the event and publish them on its intranet, internet site and other EDPS social channels (Twitter, LinkedIn and YouTube). Please note that if you agree on appearing in photos or filmed, you have to give us your

consent in the registration form. Should you not consent, the organising team will make any possible arrangements to respect your choice.

After 10 years from the event, we will archive the event material, including reports and audio-video footage (data will no longer be available online).

### **Why do we process your personal data and under what legal basis?**

The lawfulness of the organisation of the event is based on Article 5(1)(a) of the Regulation, the applicable legal basis is the Regulation itself, and in particular those provisions establishing the EDPS and its tasks.

For processing photos and videos where you might appear, the lawfulness is based on Article 5(1)(d) of the Regulation, i.e. on data subjects' consent.

### **What are your rights regarding your personal data?**

You have the right of access to your personal data and to relevant information concerning how we use it. You have the right to rectify your personal data. Under certain conditions, you have the right to ask that we delete your personal data or restrict its use. You have the right to object to our processing of your personal data, on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time. We will consider your request, take a decision and communicate it to you.

You can send your request to the EDPS by post in a sealed envelope or use our contact form on the EDPS website (see section on contact details [below](#)).

### **How to withdraw your consent and the consequences of doing this**

If you have already provided your consent for photos and videos and you decide to withdraw your consent, you can contact us and we will do what technically and organisationally possible to accomplish your request as soon as possible.

Please note that withdrawing your consent does not affect the lawfulness of any processing based on your consent before this consent is withdrawn.

### **You have the right to lodge a complaint**

If you have any remarks or complaints regarding the way we process your personal data, we invite you to contact the EDPS DPO (see section on contact details [below](#)).
