#### ***"AN ORWELLIAN PREMONITION: A DISCUSSION ON THE PERILS OF BIOMETRIC SURVEILLANCE"***

The European Data Protection Supervisor (hereinafter "EDPS", "we", "us", "our") processes your personal data to organise and manage the webinar *"An Orwellian premonition: a discussion on the perils of biometric surveillance"*.

We process your personal data based on Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC (hereinafter "the Regulation").

We provide the following information based on Article 15 and 16 of the Regulation.

#### **Who is the controller?**

The controller is the European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS).

The online meeting is supported by a webinar tool operated by TU Delft University acting as a processor, as mandated by the EDPS.

TU Delft also collects service usage data for aggregate statistics to monitor the utilization, performance, and availability of their webinar tool and servers, based on their legitimate interests.

For the purposes of this webinar, EDPS will cooperate with the following provider of the conferencing service of the webinar: **BigBlueButton**.

EDPS will not transfer your data to the above-mentioned conferencing service provider.

When you register, you will receive the link to access the webinar. By using the link to access the webinar, you are being transferred to the digital environment of the University of Delft (NL), which will provide the servers to host this event.

### **What personal data do we process, who can access it, how long do we keep your personal data and under what legal basis?**

EDPS will collect and process your personal data only for the purposes of the event management, which involves the following processing activities:

- ✓ sending email invitations and processing participation requests;
- ✓ recording the audio and video of the events and publish them on its intranet, internet site and other EDPS social channels (Twitter, LinkedIn), including projecting social media usernames on the Twitter wall and use the mail sent for the registration for event follow-up actions such as reports;
- ✓ processing your chat messages sent to everybody to be able to reply to questions. The chat will not be recorded.

**If you are a speaker**, you will need to switch on your camera and share your screen, as necessary. We will also publish the agenda of the meeting with your name, affiliation and intervention title. We might also publish other personal data you provide us with at the event, such as presentations.

**If you are a participant**, we invite you not to switch on your video and audio signals. Should you do it, this will be under your personal responsibility.

We will remove event material, including reports and audio-video recordings, after 10 years at the latest, so that it will no longer be available online or in directly accessible file systems. Some of the material may be transferred to the EDPS archives.

Please note that the online webinar tool, beyond video and audio footage and chat messages, collects some other pieces of your personal data:

- Type and Version of your Web browser
- Your operating system
- The website from which you were redirected to our service
- The exact websites you visited on our service
- Timestamps of your accesses
- The IPv4/IPv6 addresses from which you access our service
- The names of rooms you visit
- Your phone number if you dial-in via your phone
- Metadata of the conference system (start/end of sessions, number of users, the name you selected when joining a room) in order to be able to provide the service and monitor the utilization, performance and availability of their tool and servers.

The table below provides you with more specific information with regard to the processing of your personal data and replies to some basic questions depending on the type of personal data processed.

- Your name and email address	We process your name and email for the purpose of your registration in the webinar and for sending you information and follow-up regarding this specific event.	The lawfulness of the collection and processing of your email is based on your consent (Article 5(1) (d) of the Regulation).	We will delete these data at the latest ten working days after your request or after the last event follow-up action.
- The username of your choice in the web conferencing system; - your image and - your voice, (should you request us to intervene during the webinar)	We may process this data in order to introduce your intervention during the webinar (when you request to share your name and organisation and you choose to activate your camera and microphone).  Moreover, we may record the webinar and publish it on the EDPS intranet, internet site and other EDPS and EDPB social channels (Twitter, LinkedIn).	For processing your picture, name and voice, should you choose to disclose them during the webinar, the applicable legal basis is your consent (Article 5(1) (d) of the Regulation).	The EDPS will archive event material, including reports and audio-video footage, after 10 years (not available any more online).

### ***What are your rights regarding your personal data?***



The **right to be informed** of what happens to your personal data and in particular, how we collect and use your personal data, for how long we will keep it and whom it will be shared with. We are informing you of how we process your personal data with this notice.



The **right of access**, which allows you to ask for full details of the personal data we hold on you.



The **right to rectification**, which allows you to request us to correct without undue delay anything that you think is wrong with the personal data we have on file about you, and to complete any incomplete personal data.



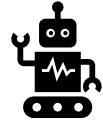
The **right to erasure**, which means that under certain conditions, you have the right to ask that we delete your personal data.



The **right to restrict the processing of your personal data**, which is the right to ask us to only temporarily use or store your personal data for certain purposes. You can exercise this right when you believe that the data is inaccurate or the processing activity is unlawful.



The **right to object**, which allows you to ask us to stop using your personal data on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time.



The **right not to be subject to automated decisions** (i.e. made solely by machines) **affecting you**, as defined by the Regulation.



Under certain circumstances, you also have the **right to data portability**. This means that you can ask for and download the personal data that you have provided us, or have generated by virtue of the use of any of the EDPS services, in order to move, copy, transfer to another organisation or keep that personal data for yourself.

Please note that withdrawing your consent does not affect the lawfulness of any processing based on your consent before the withdrawal.
