Short description and purpose of the processing	<p>The European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS) conducts at regular intervals surveys with a view to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - monitor compliance of EU institutions, agencies and bodies (EUIs) on their processing activities. <p>It is the general duty of the EDPS to monitor, ensure and enforce the application of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 by the Union institutions and bodies, offices and agencies, as well as other specific legal frameworks applicable to certain agencies (Regulation 2016/794 for Europol, Regulation 2017/1939 for EPPO, Regulation 2018/1727 for Eurojust).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - collect opinion of participants to different events organised by the EDPS (for example, EDPS-DPO meeting; International Organisations Workshop) - collect staff opinions (for example, satisfaction surveys organised by HRBA) <p>To conduct the survey the EDPS is using EUSurvey, the online survey management system developed by the European Commission. For more information, see the record on EUSurvey maintained by the Commission and the related privacy statement.</p> <p>To access the survey responders must identify with EU Login. For more information, see the EU Login Privacy Statement.</p>

Description of categories of persons whose data the EDPS processes and list of data categories	<p>Data subjects (depending on the object of the survey):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - EUIs staff responding to the survey (in principle, DPOs) - EDPS and EDPB staff - participants to events organised <p>The survey itself processes limited personal data on the responders.</p> <p>In certain cases, responders are asked to login with the EU Login in order to identify the EUI on behalf of which they respond to the survey. In other cases, in order to avoid identification, respondents will access the survey with a password provided by the EDPS.</p> <p>The categories of personal data processed, depend on the survey.</p>
9.	Time limit for keeping the data	<p>The replies to the survey are stored, as a rule, in EUSurvey until the end of the response period. As a rule, after the end of the response period, the replies to the survey (containing personal data of the respondents) will be integrated in the relevant case file in the case management system (CMS) of the EDPS and deleted from EUSurvey.</p> <p>The replies to the survey are stored, as a rule, in the CMS of the EDPS for 10 years after closure of the case. Afterwards, the replies will be transferred to the EDPS archives and undergo a second review to assess the need for continued storage.</p> <p>More specific information related to particular surveys will be provided in the specific data protection notices.</p>

Recipients of the data	<p>Access to the replies to the EDPS questionnaire is secured in the EUSurvey and in the EDPS CMS and given only to authorised staff.</p> <p>As a rule, the EDPS will not transfer any personal data to third parties, save the case when the Court of Justice of the European Union or the European Ombudsman would require such transfer</p>
