7.	Short description and purpose of the processing	The DPOs (and their deputies, if any) are the first relay of the EDPS as data protection supervisory authority for the EUIs.
		After their designation, DPOs must be registered with the EDPS by the EUI which designated them. In addition, EUIs must communicate the contact details of their DPO to the EDPS (Articles 43(5) and 44(9) of the Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 ('the Regulation').
		DPOs (and their deputies, where appropriate) are key in enabling the EDPS to exercise his tasks and powers under Articles 57 and 58 of the Regulation. In this context, the EDPS must be able to reach out either to DPOs individually (for matters that concern only their EUI), or to a targeted group of DPOs (for example the DPO Support Groups that help prepare the bi-annual EDPS DPOs meeting) or to the DPO network as whole when it comes to matters of relevance for all EUIs (biannual EDPS-DPOs meeting, EDPS surveys on specific data protection topics, submission of draft EDPS guidelines for consultation, etc.).
		The list of the members of the DPO network enables the EDPS to keep track of the EUI's obligations as to the DPO designation as well as the obligation to obtain the consent of the EDPS before dismissing a DPO from their post, and to exercise its tasks and powers under the Regulation. This list also enables the EDPS to reach out to the network for communications that are relevant to the entire network.



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		The list is also made available to the DPO network on the EDPS wiki for DPOs, which is available through EU-login and with the permission of the EDPS. Each issue of the Quick News for DPOs, a monthly newsletter sent by the EDPS (Supervisory & Enforcement unit) to the DPO network, includes the name of the DPOs whose (re-)appointment has been notified to the EDPS since the previous issue.
